Recommended sequence for 42 hour block/AA and Farmington High School graduation requirements:

~~~ all of these courses start with the word "College" on the FHS schedule AND you must PAY for tuition to earn college credit (and you must have qualifying prereqs AND test scores prior to enrollment); \*DENOTES course is eligible, depending on your plan/category, for the scholarship (see the last pages here for specific details)

Sophomore Year: 12 hours total for the academic year

\*Art History 2 (Fine Art) or \*Human Growth & Development (Pract. Art): 3 hours

\*World Civ I: 3 hours beginning 2018-19 school year; American History I 2017-18 only

\*World Civ II: 3 hours beginning 2018-19 school year; \*American History II 2017-18 only

\*Appropriate Math course: possibly 3 hours

Summer after Sophomore Year: 5 hours

\*Microapps: 3 hours Fit for Life: 2 hours (if AA)

Junior Year: 20-26 hours total for the academic year

\*College Bio: 5 hours \*HS Bio & Chem 1 prereq

\*English Comp I: 3 hours

\*Intro to Lit: 3 hours \*\*FHS required

\*American Political Systems: 3 hours

\*American History II: 3 hours (\*FHS grad requirement: 1 year of Am History)

\*Option: Elementary Spanish I (3 hours)

\*Appropriate Math Course: possibly 3-6 hours

Summer after Junior Year:

Elective, if needed, for AA degree--6-9 hours

Senior Year: 20-22 hours total for the academic year

\*Intro to Chem: 5 hours \*Chem 1 prereq

\*English Comp II: 3 hours \*Public Speaking: 3 hours \*Gen Psych: 3 hours

Choice of one of the following: \*Intro to Humanities, \*Elementary Spanish II; \*Comparative

Religions, or \*Intro Philosophy, \*World Civ I and \*World Civ II (3 hours)

## MAC scholarship information:

Mineral Area College has made a change regarding courses allowed for scholarship. Starting Fall 2017, courses required on the 42 hour general education block <u>or</u> the AAS will be the <u>only</u> courses allowed for scholarship -- the AAS covers Career Tech, which includes Biomed, PLTW, EMT, Criminal Justice, CDA, Computer Science, Health Science/Medicine/Nursing, Tech, Engineering, Radio/TV, Welding, Ag, Horticulture.

The awarded scholarship will be for 42 hours maximum during your time at FHS, and any courses dropped, or where you earn a grade D or F, will not be scholarshipped and those will be the full responsibility of the student. The scholarship award will be automatically renewed, as long as you are making adequate academic progress (course completion and GPA considerations).

Changes for the 2018-2019 year:

- sophomores will be eligible to apply with the restriction of a limit of 12 hours during the 10th grade year.
- College NOW Arts/Sciences Scholarship requires an ACT Min of 24 to apply
- College NOW Career/Tech Scholarship requires an ACT Min of 21 to apply (C/T covered fields: Biomed, PLTW, EMT, Criminal Justice, CDA, Computer Science, Health Science/Medicine/Nursing, Tech, Engineering, Radio/TV, Welding, Ag, Horticulture.)
  - o There will be no scholarship for students without these minimum ACT scores

## Changes for the 2017-2018 year:

- If awarded, scholarships will cover a maximum FHS lifetime of 42 credit hours through MAC (no electives/PE will be covered; only those courses that meet the 42 hour general education block or AAS -- examples below). Examples of covered courses available at FHS (or online):
  - o Comp 1, Comp 2, and either Public Speaking or Interpersonal Communications
  - 3 Humanities, chosen from: Intro to Lit, World Civ 1, World Civ 2, Art History 2, Intro to Humanities, Foreign Language, Philosophy, or Religion
  - American History 1 or 2 (only 1 semester; should eventually only be Am History 2)
  - American Political Systems
  - o 1 Math course, College Algebra or higher (for AAS: Tech Math 1)
  - 1 Physical science, like Intro Chemistry
  - 1 Biological science, like Gen Biology
  - 1 Social/Behavioral: Gen Psychology, online Human Growth/Development, or Gen Sociology
  - 1 Computer science: Microapps
  - courses for AAS areas such as Med Term 1 and 2, Criminal Justice, or any course in the CTE major, as long as scholarship hours are available
- Courses over and above the 42 hour general education block towards an AA will be at full student expense
- Also, there will be a new automatic scholarship for Free/Reduced Lunch students and it will cover 3
  credit hours per semester (applications will be submitted with your dual credit application in Fall) -- can
  be used alone or to pay the student portion if you are awarded one of the College NOW Scholarships:
  - NEW for 2017-2018 school year for MAC: MAC Educational Foundation Dual Credit/Enrollment Scholarship Application worth 3 credit hours per semester (for tuition, books and/or fees)
  - To apply (not a guaranteed acceptance; form is required), you must meet the following criteria:
    - 1. Eligible for Free/Reduced Lunches
    - 2. Have a minimum ACT Composite Score of 21 (or 3 areas of Accuplacer average to 60)
    - 3. Have a high school recommendation (from a counselor or principal/assistant principal)
    - 4. Have career plans that expect enrollment in high school dual credit classes
